FROM PASTOR BILL



During the month of August all of our Gospel readings are from John 6. Most all of this chapter revolves around one theme – Jesus is the Bread of Life.

As is the style of the Gospel of John, Jesus performs one “sign” and then the rest of the chapter is a commentary on the meaning of the sign. Most often this takes place in conversations Jesus has with others. The 6th chapter of John begins with the Feeding of the Five Thousand. Verses 24-71 are the commentary.

We will be reading verses 24-71 over four weeks. That is a lot of bread talk. However it is important talk. Just as bread was at the heart of eating in that day and time, Jesus is the heart of our life. Bread only sustains us in this life, Jesus, the Bread of Life, gives us eternal life. As Jesus says, “I am the Bread of Life whoever believes in me will never be hungry and whoever comes to me will never be thirsty”.

I know that there are a lot of questions about the building addition and when we are going to get started. The answer is still – this fall. Exactly what date we do not know because we still have to get the plans approved. The steps are that the land development plan has to be approved first. Then the contractor can take the building plans for approval. When that is complete we will begin! A date for groundbreaking will be announced soon.

Here are some of the things that are going on or have been completed:

- The land development plan is complete and has been submitted for approval.
- The Building Committee met with GRC, our contractor, and put some finishing touches on the plan. We are still tweaking the plan in the worship space and will have that complete by the beginning of August. One thing that is changing is that we are going to slightly slope the floor in the space. We are doing that to give better sight lines for people sitting in the back pews.
- We have met with the representative of New Holland Church Furniture to begin to get our pew order in place. As you may know we are using our present pews and adding 16 smaller pews to be on the two outer sections. We ran into one problem – the fabric we now have on the pews is no longer available. So we will have to make some adjustments of either reupholstering all our pews or just using a contrasting fabric on the new pews.
- The mortgage has been signed with Susquehanna Bank. As soon as we have a building permit we can begin to draw on that.

The bottom line is that we are moving as fast as we can but once it gets to permit approvals we are on the time line of others!

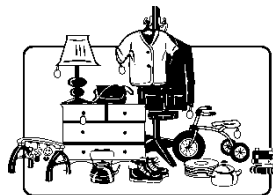
LIFE
