**Installation of Council Members January 10, 2016**

*This order of service follows the Hymn of the Day*

P: Charles Ford, Beth Ford, Andy Gehr and Cameron Schroy have been elected to our Congregation Council for a term of three years. They are asked to come forward.

P: In Holy Baptism, our Lord Jesus Christ liberated you from sin and death and made you members of his Church. Through Word and Sacrament you have been nurtured in faith. I ask you, together with all those who are here gathered, to confess the faith of the Church, the faith in which we are baptized.

P: Please turn to page 105 in the front of the worship book as we confess our faith using the Apostles' Creed.

P: *St. Paul writes:* There are different kinds of spiritual gifts, but the same Spirit gives them. There are different ways of serving, but the same Lord is served. There are different abilities to perform service, but the same God gives to everyone ability for particular service. The Spirit's presence is shown in some way in each person, for the good of all. (I Corinthians 12:4-7)

P: You are to see that the words and deeds of this household of faith reflect him in whose name we gather.
