 and great is the majesty of your glory.


You so loved the world that you gave your only Son,

we proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.




Remembering, therefore, his salutary command,

We practice Open Communion at Trinity. If you commune in your own tradition or home congregation, you are certainly welcome to receive Holy Communion today. Come forward at the direction of the usher, receive a small cup from the tray and then come to the Pastor. You will receive the bread and eat it. Then have your cup filled by one of the Communion Assistants. The first one pours wine and the second, grape juice. After you drink this place the empty cup in the tray held by the acolyte and return to your seat. During the distribution of Communion you are welcome to sing the following hymns along with the choir:

- 384 – That Easter Day with Joy Was Bright,
- 449 – We Know that Christ Is Raised,
- 857 – Lord I Lift Your Name on High
