Dear Family,

Soon, we'll be celebrating July 4, Independence Day. The day has lost its meaning over the years. Today, many people look on Independence Day as a chance for picnics and fireworks. This year it will be particularly difficult as people wrestle with how to celebrate safely with Covid19 still very much a part of the landscape.

Independence Day is much more than a time for fun and celebration. It's actually the day we commemorate the signing of the Declaration of Independence. In 1776, the Continental Congress declared that the thirteen American colonies were no longer subject to the monarch of Britain, King George III, and were now united, free, and independent states. Becoming free came with a price, though. The war for freedom lasted from 1775 – 1783.

With Independence Day looming, I've been reflecting on what freedom means. We disciples of Jesus have a unique perspective that might help us with all the uncertainty and tension that abounds at the moment.

There's a lot of discussion in the Bible about freedom. The definition of freedom in the Bible is hard to hear as Americans. Our culture is firmly based on the idea of individualism. I've heard a lot over the last few weeks about individual rights and in the United States we get to do what we want. I wonder what Jesus would have us do?

The inner circle of Jesus' followers asked Him to teach them to pray. We use that prayer a lot, at meetings, in our personal devotions and every worship service. We call it the Lord's Prayer. Here's a small section that will be familiar:

Your kingdom come. Your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. (Matt 6:10)

YOUR kingdom come. YOUR will be done. Freedom for Jesus seems to have a much different meaning. Instead of freedom to do whatever we want, our deepest freedom is doing and becoming what GOD wants. As we've seen over and over again in Scripture after Scripture, that doing and becoming is grounded in love; love for yourself and love for your neighbor.

As Luther asks often in the Small Catechism, "What does this mean?" I wonder if it means that, first and foremost, we pray daily for God to fill our hearts with open hearted love and compassion. I wonder if perhaps it means letting go of our own way of thinking, to really listen to someone else's point of view. I wonder if it means putting on a mask, even if it's uncomfortable, because someone around you might be immune compromised and at risk for serious complications from Covid. I wonder if it means being open to different styles of worship music knowing a brother or sister will be blessed. I wonder if it means... you fill in the blank.

The freedom Jesus calls us to isn't a freedom from but a freedom for. There is always a cost. The cost for spiritual freedom is losing your life – your ego and focus on yourself – and finding true freedom in the love of God. May we at Trinity live into that freedom.

Food insecurity will be on the rise as safety nets are stopped and the county reaches the green phase in COVID response. Placing bags on the doors in our neighborhood, asking them to fill the bags with food and then collecting the food is a safe activity that can make a

big difference for our hungry neighbors. We will not stay to put the food on the shelves. The room is simply too small for safe social distancing. Each team will be a family unit assigned to a specific area to keep ourselves safely distanced.
