Dear Family,

This past Sunday, November 29, we lit the first blue candle of Advent. The Advent season has begun. Advent comes from the Latin word, *Adventus*. It means coming. Who is coming? Jesus, of course! During Advent we use the liturgical color blue; blue is a waiting color. Followers of Jesus wait in hope expecting Jesus to come.

This first Sunday of Advent, we remember again that Advent isn't about Christmas but the coming of Jesus. Baby Jesus is already born over 2000 years ago. And while we remember that historic event and the importance it holds for the world and especially ourselves. We aren't WAITING for it.

Instead, we live the mystery of our faith. Christ HAS come. Christ IS come. Christ WILL come.

We spend time at Trinity every Sunday reminding people to share where they've seen God. God IS present and active in our lives right now. Yet, we also confess that Jesus is coming at the end of the age. We're in that already and not yet between time. Jesus gives us a road map for waiting during this in-between time – between Jesus present today and Jesus coming at the end of the age.

So, why Advent? Advent is MORE than a simple countdown to Christmas. Advent reminds us to slow down, even in the hussle of the holiday frenzy, and make time to deepen our relationships with God. What spiritual practices is God calling you to renew or begin? How might you day be shaped by your connection with God?

Recognizing THAT we wait and HOW we wait are important to our walks with God. That's where Christmas makes a difference. Yes, we aren't waiting for baby Jesus. Yet, Jesus' coming as a vulnerable infant DOES matter to who we are and how we are in the world. Think about it! Christmas is a celebration of the incarnation. Incarnation is a big church word meaning became flesh. We hear that particularly in the prologue of John's gospel: John 1:14

And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth.

The word became flesh. Jesus gave up everything it means to be "God" to become one of us. God must love us A LOT to want to become us. The fact that God loves you is NOT a trite saying. It is who God is and the basis for our relationship with God. We know we have value because we are beloved children of God.

Equally important is the mystery that since we are followers of Christ, we are called to be incarnational as well. We are called to bring God's word of love and healing to our broken world. We join with God in bringing the kingdom of heaven on earth.

We are incarnational when we live from our center that is God's love and peace: when we speak kindly to the people around us, especially to those who particularly annoy us or hold different political views. When we give our time, talent or money to help alleviate suffering in the world. When we focus on what really matters: our relationship to God, ourselves and our neighbors. May Christ bless you in your Advent journey.

### UPDATE

### **WORSHIP IN THE SANCTUARY**

The executive team continues to evaluate worship in light of the recent Covid surge. For the present, sanctuary worship at 10AM will continue. The

team will meet Dec 7 to reevaluate. We will continue to update you. Please avail yourself of the on-line options if that feels safer to you. Worship is broadcast via Facebook Live and downloaded to YouTube and the website after the service.

If you attend in sanctuary worship, please follow mask and social distance safety measures. We have added these guidelines: If you have a temperature or feel ill, do not attend worship in the sanctuary. Please observe a 14-day self-quarantine if you have been traveling. Please use hand sanitizer before entering the sanctuary.



### POINSETTIAS IN THE SANCTUARY

The tradition at Trinity has been to have the poinsettias decorate the sanctuary from the second Sunday in Advent until Christmas. Covid has once again challenged our creativity. You will see many of the plants adorning the narthex until Christmas Eve.

We discovered the ozone generator used to disinfect the sanctuary will kill the plants if they are in the sanctuary. The generator runs Sunday evening after midnight for several hours. The compromise is that volunteers will place a few plants each Sunday in the sanctuary for worship and then remove them after the service. Christmas Eve, volunteers will place all the plants in the sanctuary before the 11AM service and then

Love for our friends and enemies alike.

Joy in Christ, who makes all things new.

God, who promises to make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert, will prepare us and equip us to do "new things" to steward our lives and congregations to meet the challenges ahead.
