Dear Family,

After worship on April 25th, the Finance Team partnered with the Renewal Team to present the first of several "State of the Union" forums to provide a deeper picture of Trinity's mission, ministry, and resources. We hope to provide brief updates every few months rather than simply waiting until the Congregational Meeting.

Clear information about resources and ministry will help all of us to pray about how God is calling us to participate in the work of the church. Specific information shared at the forum from both the Finance and Renewal teams can be found in the newsletter.

We are moving forward as a congregation. WE are the church not the building. Covid has given us an opportunity to experience that firsthand. The church is relationships NOT a structure. We don't GO to church; we ARE the church. Hand in hand, guided by the Holy Spirit, we support each other and our neighbors.

Before Covid closed the building, the renewal team held several conversations during worship using the PAWN process. The intention was to discover Trinity's (P)urpose by exploring our (A)ssets, (W)ows and (N)eeds. Using the information from those conversations, the renewal team discerned principles which describe what our faith family looks like when we're at our best. These are principles which will not only guide our ministry moving forward but will also help us encourage one another to live into God's vision for who we are called to be with one another and our neighbors.

- Passionate about God
- Feeding the hungry physically, emotionally and spiritually
- Open, welcoming, and friendly
- Courage to creatively use our gifts in the community

We'll concentrate on one principle each month over the course of the summer to explore deeply what each one means for us as a congregation. May's principle is: Passionate about God.

Passion is hard to define but we all know it when we see it. When we're passionate, we give a lot of energy and focus. Jobs, family, sports all claim our attention and when we're passionate about those things they take priority. One of the principles the team discerned from the congregation is that on our best days Trinity is passionate about God. That means God is a focus and priority.

We show our enthusiasm for God in our lives through praise at worship and spending time with God through personal spiritual practice. We allow God space to transform our hearts and minds, so we see others with Jesus' eyes, hear with Jesus' ears and love with Jesus' heart. Our decisions about how we use our time, money and talent are grounded in God's love. Our passion for God compels us to serve each other and our neighbors.

In May, we will focus on what it means to be passionate about God. We will have time to respond to God's love in our worship services. To encourage one another, the renewal team will be making videos of members of our family answering the question, "What does being passionate about God mean to you?"

May our passion for God reflect God's light to those around us!

STATE OF THE UNION

A short 'State of the Union' presentation was hosted after the worship service on April 25th. We want to provide a deeper picture of Trinity's mission, ministry and resources more than once a year at the Congregational Meeting. We hope to provide brief updates like this every few months.

In addition to a presentation by the renewal team on the focus for ministry this summer, the Finance Committee presented an update of our finances to show the latest trends. Our Synod guidance is that it will be another 6 months before we know if these trends are the new reality or if we will get back to pre-Covid (2019) levels. At this point, we are simply monitoring the data and communicating to the congregation.

Additionally, the Finance Team shared that the Estate of Ingrid Collins will be making a gift to Trinity in the amount of \$ 37,862.71. We are truly blessed by Ingrid's kindness and generosity. Trinity will tithe 10% of the gift to benevolences or charities chosen by the council. The remainder of the gift will be deposited into an interest-bearing account to be used to cover future financial deficits or other needs of the church.

"Honor your father and your mother, so that your days may be long in the land that the Lord your God is giving you." –Exodus 20:12
