Dear Family in Christ,

As many of you already know, one of my hobbies is gardening. I have been growing things since I was a small child when my grandfather gave me half a row in his massive gardens on his farm. Both he and my grandmother taught me the difference between weeds and plants, the difference between annuals, perennials, and biennials. He taught me about what to do to combat blossom end rot on tomato plants. My grandmother taught us how to find and pick wild asparagus as it grew along the stone wall on the perimeter of their land.

They taught me how to pick strawberries, wild raspberries and wild black raspberries and high bush blueberries and even gooseberries. So, I really love to grow things. I also enjoy cooking which the same grandmother taught me. She didn't use many recipes. Some of the things she taught me to cook, I learned from watching her over and over again. I can make homemade egg pasta, potato pancakes, German apple pancakes, homemade ravioli, potato soup, butter soup all without recipes.

The other thing I learned from my mom and from my grandmother, was prayer. My mom taught us the Lord's Prayer and so we would kneel at the side of our beds every night and pray. My mom learned form her mother, who taught her the Lord's Prayer, and the Apostle's Creed – in German.

What were you taught as a child? Think about this. What do you remember being taught to do or to say? Now think about this- what have you taught to your children, grandchildren, nieces and nephews? We build relationships when we teach our traditions to one another.

Teaching traditions is what Confirmation is all about. We teach scripture and we teach Luther's Catechism.

In his letter to the church at Corinth, St. Paul writes:" I handed on to you as of first importance what I in turn had received: that Christ died for our sins according to the scriptures." This is handing on the tradition. Earlier in 1 Corinthians he also talks about handing on the faith tradition in eating and drinking in the Lord's Supper.

Just like my grandparents handed family traditions down to me, so we are to hand on the faith to our children. That's what parents promise when their child is baptized, and that is what the confirmands take up in their Affirmation of Baptism. They pick up for themselves the traditions of the church, the faith that their parents took up for them at Baptism. They are now mature enough to carry on the faith tradition themselves.

This is a good thing. Join us on June 5th as five young people take up their faith together. Pray for them that they may remain in faith throughout their lives and hand the tradition down to their children. Join us for a time of fellowship following the service and congratulate them. Share the Spirit!
