Family in Christ gathered at Trinity,

We are now in the season of Lent. Lent is a time of reflection and contemplation. We reflect on Jesus' life, his ministry on earth, and his journey to Jerusalem. It is about his betrayal, arrest, crucifixion, death and burial. It's a time for us to consider our own lives and our own sinfulness, the things we do wrong and the good that we fail to do. Most of all, as Lent ends and Holy Week begins, we consider our role in the crucifixion. We remember the words on Ash Wednesday, "Remember you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

All of this is part of following the Church Year Calendar as we do. We follow the seasons of the church year, the festivals, the commemorations and the High Holy Days. By following the Church Calendar we live into the life, ministry, death and resurrection of Jesus. Nothing shows this more than our living into Lent, Holy Week and the Great Three Days of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Vigil of Easter. Without Lent and Holy Week there would be no Easter.

Our faith through all of this is a way of life for us. That way of life is a part of us here at Trinity. We do not come to worship ourselves, but we come to worship and give thanks to God for loving us enough to save us in the sacrifice of His Son, Jesus, on the cross. We give back to God for his forgiveness, his love, his grace, his sacrifice. This faith way of life is a part of us here at Trinity, but it was also a part of you when you were on Baltimore St. It was a part of you when you gathered at the fire hall for worship, and it was a part of you when you began here. It is a part of you now and will be a part of you wherever you are, and wherever you go. You carry it with you.

The cooperative midweek services are an exercise in a wider view of worship. The gathering of the three congregations, Trinity, Evangelical, and Salem, and really all of our Chambersburg Conference, is a testimony to the faith that we share. We are doing something different and yet the same. We are gathering at different sites, with different people. It is a reminder that our worship is bigger than just our congregation, in this place. This faith we hold in common with the people of the other two congregations, those throughout our conference, the synod, and the whole ELCA. While we are with different people, in different places and experiencing differing fellowship and worship etc., it is the same Jesus Christ in whom we believe, in whom we trust and in whom we have our salvation. Whether here, or there, Christ is the same. Our salvation is the same and we are known and loved by God.

THE STATE OF THE CHURCH

Last Fall the Call Committee of Trinity met with the congregation to give information concerning the call process and to answer any questions that the congregation had. At that time they informed the congregation that with the mortgage debt, and costs of running the church, (including non-clergy employee salaries) Trinity cannot afford a pastor or even a part-time pastor.

In January at the congregational meeting, a *Power Point* slide presentation was given explaining the finances, and also that Trinity cannot afford a pastor.

The salary and housing for a pastor just out of seminary is approximately \$60,000. This does **NOT** include health benefits, pension, or Social Security and mileage. Trinity cannot afford a pastor.

Add to all of this the fact that there are very **few** pastors anymore, especially pastors willing to work part-time.

The ELCA has:

578 congregations with no pastor

278 pastors looking for call.

The Synod has:

8 congregations interviewing for full time pastors.

11 congregations wanting part time pastors, and

14 congregations working on Mission Site Profiles.

The synod has had at least 5 candidates since September leave the candidacy process due to bad congregational experiences. (These are seminarians).

The synod has 2-3 pastors from outside the synod looking for calls in our synod, but at the same time they have their information in with other synods as well. There is one seminarian graduating in May who wishes to stay in our synod.

Trinity's Call Committee is currently reviewing the Mission Site Profile (MSP) that they worked on earlier this year. Please note: the MSP is not an easy document to work on. It is extremely lengthy and complex.
