Family in Christ,


In Lent we consider and reflect on our lives and the ways we do and do not follow God's Word. We reflect on the sacrifice of Christ on the cross for the forgiveness of **our** sins. We reflect on the above verse from First Peter 2: "by his wounds you have been healed." Through Lent we follow Jesus on his journey to Jerusalem, to his Last Supper with his disciples, his arrest, trial, crucifixion, death and burial. MINUTES OF JANUARY JOINT COUNCIL MEETING

A joint meeting the Congregational Councils was held Monday, January 22, 2024, at Trinity Lutheran Church with The Rev. Richard Jorgensen and The Rev. Dana Blouch-Hanson.

At this meeting ELC and TLC both gave a report of where they both stand with the Call Process.

Sheila Rushlow of ELC reported on the progress of the Ministry Site Profile (MSP) and thanked TLC for their guidance with this. The Call Committee is planning on having two more meetings with their congregation on the call process.

Darrell Swart of TLC reported that Trinity is moving along and that TLC and ELC have been working together with Christmas, Lent and Holy Week. He followed up with Revs. Jorgensen and Blouch-Hanson on the profile submitted as it says "pending." The profile is "pending" as Synod is waiting to hear what the two churches are planning: merging or consolidating.

Rev. Blouch-Hanson gave advice on the MSP. TLC and ELC can either submit their profile together or keep it separate. If there is a consolidation of the two churches, it can be consolidated into one document. Both churches should continue with the call process and Synod is going to continue with the search for a pastor.

Pastor Jorgensen suggested a workshop renewal on a Saturday, think about leadership teams and to read "When Church Stops Working" and "Anatomy of a Revived Church." He also said we should "pause (to catch our breath), ponder (what does God want us to do) and pray." What direction is God leading us? He also assured us that the Synod is working on resources for us. They will accommodate and help us on a joint ministry, merger or consolidation, whichever we choose. He would also like the two congregations to have two worship services and lunch together, one at TLC and one at ELC, and to engage in the community together/work on a community project together.

Next meeting is April 15, 2024, at 6p.m. at ELC.

Pastor Denise Horn closed with prayer.
