Dear Family in Christ,

We are so very fortunate to have members and employees who care for Trinity and its future. We are so fortunate to have all of you as members of the body of Jesus Christ gathered in this place.

We all know that Trinity's future is uncertain. Trinity is not the only congregation in this spot. There are many. There are only 6 congregations in our conference that have full time pastors. There are 11 who do not have pastors and use interim pastors, or just Sunday supply pastors.

To continue to be in this place for a few more years the Council, the Synod and the Council at Evangelical have been discussing what we can do together. Neither congregation can afford a full-time pastor. Despite what you might hear in the community, **neither congregation can afford a full-time pastor.** The salary for a new pastor is \$60,070 (including housing allowance). This does not include Pension (rate is 12%) or Benefits (close to another \$30,000) or Social Security allowance, or Continuing Ed, or Professional expenses, etc. If you have a pastor with multiple degrees, or professional certificates, that's even more money.

It seems the best plan for both congregations would be to share a pastor. For more info on that please read Matt Cessna's article in this newsletter.

I encourage you to attend the meeting we are having with our Synod representatives on June 9, following the service. They will entertain questions on what sharing a pastor could look like. This is not a merger, but a sharing of pastoral leadership. Please keep an open mind. I would love nothing better than to have both congregations be financially independent and viable, but that is not the case. We need to be looking to do something to ensure our future ministry in this place.

I want to thank you all for your continued support of Trinity and its mission to Christ Jesus. I especially want to thank all who participate in our weekly worship services, both those just attending and those volunteering as ushers and communion helpers. To our assisting ministers I give special thanks because I appreciate all that they do to aid me and to make our worship experience all that it is.

Even more so, I want to thank Saundra, our wonderful church musician for her continued hard work to support our worship of God, as well as our wonderful choir and song leaders. Thank you all for all that you do. You are all appreciated! Blessings to us all as we serve our Lord.

MEETING JUNE 9 FOLLOWING WORSHIP SERVICE!

Dear Friends at Trinity,

At our last meeting with ELC and the Synod, we discussed a couple of options for having a shared pastor for the two congregations.

The discussion revolved around possibly having a shared pastor through a term call. A term call is exactly what it sounds like. The pastor would be called for a set length of time or term. The typical term call is in the range of 3 to 4 years, but can be any length of time that is agreed on by the congregations and the pastor being called.

The benefit of a term call is that there in no obligation by either party to continue the call after the term expires. It could be beneficial in finding a pastor since there may be a pastor that does not want to make a long term commitment to a congregation.

Having a shared pastor would be beneficial to assist in our discussions for the future of the two churches. Since the shared pastor would be in direct contact with both congregations, they would get a good feel for the wants and needs of each congregation. They would also help us decide what our shared ministry might ultimately look like. If that is the route we decide on, there are a couple of options regarding what our shared ministry might look like.

1. Separate- Stay two separate congregations, but share a pastor.

2. Partnership – Combine congregations, but stay in separate buildings. In this option we could still share committees and have joint services and other activities on occasion.

3. Stay separate congregations, but share one building.

These are just a few examples of what a shared ministry might look like.

Another benefit of having a shared pastor is that the cost would be split between the two congregations. The split could be any percentage that works. If the time is split 50-50 between the two congregations, then the cost would be split 50-50. If the time split is 60-40, then the cost would be split 60-40 and so on.

Council will be discussing this a one of our upcoming meetings. Then the council would make recommendations to the congregation and we would call a congregational meeting to discuss. We don't need to make any final decisions at this meeting but rather get a consensus from the congregation as to how we might want to move forward.

A representative from the synod will be joining us at our Sunday service on June 9th to answer any questions you may have. I encourage you to think about this between now and then and come prepared with any questions you may have. If you are not able to attend that Sunday and you have questions you would like asked, please contact a member of council or send your questions to the church office.

I look forward to seeing you all June 9th. Please try to be present that Sunday because this is a great chance to get your questions answered. The synod representative will certainly be able to answer your questions better then the council members will be able to.
