APOLOGY TO THE AUGSBURG CONFESSION



Last time, we looked at the Lutheran Confession called the Augsburg

Confession, a set of 28 articles defining the faith. The Holy Roman Emperor, interested in bringing the Church back into unity, mostly under the Church of Rome, asked for the Catholic princes and teachers to respond to the Augsburg Confession, which they did. The Confutation of the Augsburg Confession went

article by article. Some they had little to disagree with. Others they took exception to. Unfortunately, an English translation is not easy to find. The Jacobs two volume *Book of Concord* with supporting documents written in 1880's has one. However, you can get a sense of the objections by the next of the Confessions: the Apology of the Augsburg Confession (also written in 1530).


A vocabulary note is necessary, here. Common modern use of the word "apology" usually is associated with the words, "I'm sorry". The Church often does not use the word in this sense but uses the old sense of the word as "an explanation" or "a defense". The Apology of the Augsburg Confession is further explanation and defense of the areas in dispute with the Church of Rome. The articles of the Augsburg Confession to which both sides agreed are only acknowledged in passing, while the items in dispute have a vigorous defense in detail. Thus the articles on God fly by, but the fourth article on "Justification by Faith" gets a defense of many pages.

Read the Augsburg Confession for an overview of what we believe as Lutherans. Then read the Apology to the Augsburg Confession to see where Lutherans differ in the understanding of faith from the Catholics with an explanation of why.
