Imagine the trauma for my parents to have their two-week-old baby hospitalized and in an Oxygen tent. Obviously, I survived.

When I was still a child, at dinner with my grandparents, I choked on a chicken bone and was saved by my grandmother.

I am grateful to God for the doctor from the Philippines. I am grateful to God for my grandmother. Above all, I am grateful.

Our faith teaches us to be grateful. God who created humankind, all humankind, gave us the world that we live in, provided us with aptitudes to do what we need in order to provide for ourselves and our families, gave us the ability to reason, to think, and to be compassionate, loved us and still loves us. We are grateful, at least we are supposed to be.

In worship we are giving back to God our prayers, praise and thanks for all that God has done for us and for all that God continues to do for us. God sacrificed his son Jesus for our salvation. 
BIBLE AND BREW



LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF

October is Lutheran World Relief Ingathering Month in the Lower Susquehanna Synod and Trinity's Special Appeal for October. Lutheran World Relief is a ministry of the Lutherans throughout the world. It serves people around the world who are living in poverty. This year marks their 80th Anniversary of helping people throughout the world. The following letter was received from them:

DEAR PARTNER IN MINISTRY,

Eighty years ago, our Lutheran forebearers had a vision to join

together and be the Body of Christ in the world, responding boldly to the needs of our neighbors in Europe after World War II. When they founded Lutheran World Relief in 1945, the outpouring of love was immense. Our grandparents got busy sewing quilts and organizing fundraising drives. Within just 14 years, American Lutherans had provided more than \$100 million worth of aid. And we were just getting started.

Over these 80 years of faithful service, our ministry together has grown. Today — together — we go where no one else goes ... to the front lines of war and to places even cars can't reach. And we stay as long as we're needed to help families recover and rebuild. We can't predict where or when the next urgent need may arise. But we know we can always count on YOU to respond in love and create a brighter future for the next generation.

Dear Council Members,

Per the recommendation of the Synod, we convened a Collaborative Team composed of three members from each congregation. Our team met monthly since July 2024 and accomplished the following:

- Opened communication between the two congregations through the church office announcements; inviting new friends to our special worship, events and mission work.
- Encouraged participation of both congregations in Bible Studies. Bible and Brew has been a very successful collaboration. Equal numbers of members from each congregation have also participated in the Women's Bible Study held Tuesdays at Trinity.
- Held two game nights to open the door to making new friends from each congregation. Both nights were a lot of fun, with Bunco being a truly exciting joint social event.

The Team is grateful we had this opportunity, as we have made new friends and felt the spirit of both congregations while participated in these joint events. We feel it is time to dissolve this team. We have worked diligently with great communication, personal invitations to participate in events, and hours of planning. The work done is not reflected in the outcome. While we have had some wins in bringing the congregations closer together, we have not seen the hoped for participation from the members of each church. Specifically, it was often the case that only those on the Collaboration Team would attend open-invitation events by the other congregation. We are not abandoning the progress made. Going forward, the team has agreed to:

- Continue communication and invitation to each congregation on our events and special ministry opportunities.
- Worship jointly during Lent.
- Continue to support and encourage of members to participate in the Bible Study groups.
- Communicate as a team to hold game nights jointly organized once or twice a year.
- Joint participation will be planned for the community event, Heritage Christmas.

While the team was hoping for greater participation and thus, greater joint ministry, we are thankful for this opportunity and feel that it has indeed strengthened our congregations. It was not a wasted effort and has forged new friendships, thriving ministries (Bible and Brew), and the expectation of continued community presence as a local Lutheran body.
